

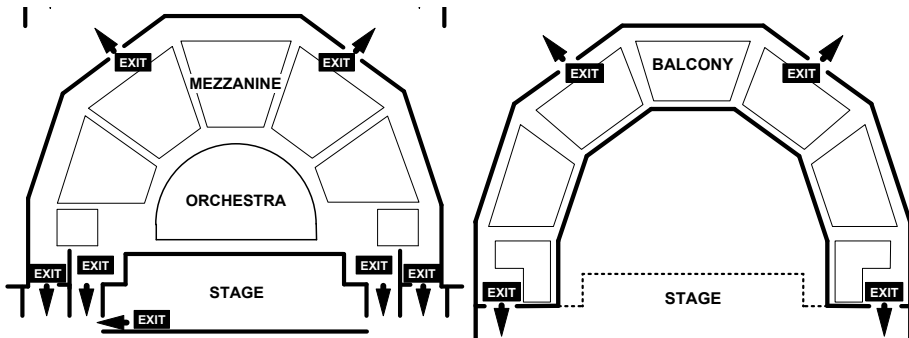

The Phi Beta Kappa Society was founded in 1776 by five students at the College of William & Mary in Williamsburg, Virginia. Harvard's chapter, Alpha of Massachusetts, was chartered in 1781 and remains the oldest continuously operating chapter. Radcliffe's chapter, Iota of Massachusetts, was chartered in 1914, and the two chapters merged to form Alpha Iota in 1995. These Literary Exercises have been a part of Harvard's commencement activities since 1782.
